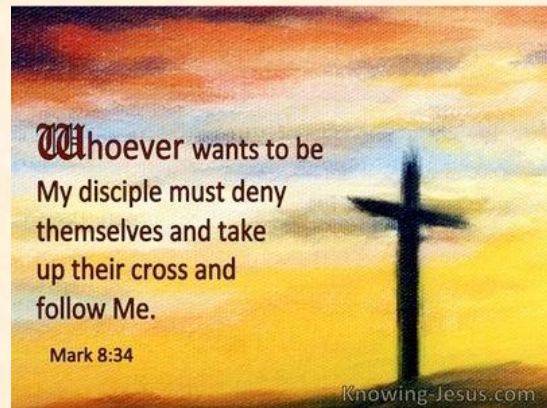

This Sunday we contemplate Jesus, who is, as Peter declares, the Christ, the anointed one of God. Our readings help us to understand the journey Jesus takes to show his love for us.

The First Reading from Isaiah is part of the song of the Suffering Servant. He is to suffer much but he retains his complete confidence and trust in God. The section of the Psalm given today complements this reading. The psalmist suffers greatly but gives thanks because the Lord has heard his cry and saved him. James, in the Second Reading, underlines the practical consequences of our faith: the loving response the faithful follower must give.

In the Gospel, Jesus questions his disciples about what people are saying of him. When Peter declares that he is the Christ, Jesus reveals the suffering ahead of him and also, that we his disciples, are to follow the same path.

In our prayer this week, perhaps we can be conscious that we are disciples of Jesus, living out our lives in his name.

Additional COVID-19 Protocols

As announced by the NSW government effective 11 September 2021

- Attendance at places of worship is limited to one person per four square metres.

- Masks are to be worn in all indoor non-residential settings (ie churches).
- Singing by the congregation at indoor places of worship is not allowed.

A reading from the Letter of St James 2: 14-18

Take the case, my brothers and sisters, of someone who has never done a single good act but claims that they have faith.

Will that faith save them? If one of the brothers or one of the sisters is in need of clothes and has not enough food to live on, and one of you says to them, 'I wish you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty', without giving them these bare necessities of life, then what good is that? Faith is like that: if good works do not go with it, it is quite dead.

This is the way to talk to people of that kind: 'You say you have faith and I have good deeds; I will prove to you that I have faith by showing you my good deeds – now prove to me that you have faith without any good deeds to show.' The word of the Lord.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 8: 27-35

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put this question to his disciples, 'Who do people say I am?' And they told him. 'John the Baptist,' they said; 'others Elijah; others again, one of the prophets.'

'But you', he asked, 'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And Jesus gave them strict orders not to tell anyone about him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be rejected by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, and to be put to death, and after three days to rise again; and he said all this quite openly. Then, taking him aside, Peter started to remonstrate with him. But turning and seeing his disciples, Jesus rebuked Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan! Because the way you think is not God's way but as human beings think.'

He called the people and his disciples to him and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let them renounce themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For anyone who wants to save their life will lose it; but anyone who loses their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.'
