CHILDRENS LITURGY:

Children's liturgy is offered in Sacred Heart parish community each second and fourth Sunday during school terms.



The readings for this week invite us to consider how to live as followers of Jesus in our communities and in our world. In the First Reading, God speaks to the people of Israel about how they should treat the oppressed and down-trodden, in order to please God.

The Psalm reminds us that we can only live the lives that God wants by relying on him: he is our rock, our strength, our saviour, our mighty help. St Paul writes to the Thessalonians that we should all be imitators of the Lord, in the joy of the Holy Spirit (Second Reading).

In the Gospel, Jesus asks us to express the love of God that fills our hearts, our souls and our minds, by treating others as we would want to be treated ourselves. We find in others the image of the God who is love.

This week, we may like to pray that God will help us to grow in love of him. We ask that we will be able to respond to God when we see others as Christ Jesus in our midst.

A Prayer for peace in Israel and Gaza

Heavenly Father, we pray for the many people whose lives have been torn apart by conflict in Gaza and Israel.

God of Love, Source of all hope and good things; You call us in love, to share in the work and ongoing life of our Sacred Heart Parish.


Bless this parish of ours and lead us to be confident and joyful in serving those around us, so that through us, the world may catch a glimpse of the love you have for each one of us.

From Bishop Mark Edwards

I have paraphrased a letter written to priests of the diocese and addressed to parishioners originally released on 20th October. Since that time some issues concerning what is disclosed in the public arena continue to evolve.

Last week the Daily Advertised and Border Mail published news that the Wagga diocese is being sued by four men for sexual abuse committed by the then Fr Kiss.

The diocese admits that the abuse happened and indeed it had reached deeds of settlement on that basis with the four men in the years around 2005. However, with recent changes to Victorian legislation, those who reached settlements previously are able to apply to have the amount of their settlement revisited. These four men are exercising that right.

There has been an attempt at mediation but, as yet, not all of the men and the diocese have not been able to agree on mutually acceptable amounts so some cases are going to court for the court to decide.

Vincent Kiss is laicized, that is, he is no longer a priest. He admitted to these offences and has served prison terms for them.

The hurt and damage from these crimes and sins is serious and spreads out like a ripple across a pond. I ask you please to join me in praying for these four men who are the primary victims. Let us also hold in our prayers those who love and support them. As well, I remember and pray for you who love Jesus and the church and are hurt by this too.

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: Book of Exodus

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this, "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt, You must not be harsh with the widow or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans. If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him. If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen for I am full of pity. The word of the Lord.

A reading from the First Letter of Paul to the Thessalonians

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread—and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 22: 34-40

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees, they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question: 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the Law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all you heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: you must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.' The Gospel of the Lord.
