TO PONDER:

Behind our first reading lies a deep yearning for God's continuing presence through the firmness of David's line and the creation of a stable "house" or temple for God. This ancient yearning becomes our yearning. As Christians, we believe that Christ has already broken into this world and transformed it. We believe Christ is everywhere. Yet this can be difficult to see. We are so close to Christmas, to Christ in our midst, to Beauty incarnate through the brokenness and instability of the world, to power and promise within the fragility of a baby's body. In preparation for Christmas, this is a week to meditate on the remarkable, mysterious cycle of our faith, and on what incarnation means for us tangibly in our lives, in the pain and beauty of our world.

"Aren't there annunciations of one sort or another in most lives?" wrote Denise Levertov. Most go unnoticed; we do not often receive visits by great angels. Yet the scene between Mary and Gabriel points to us, toward our own process of understanding, openness, and willingness to become pregnant by the Spirit, despite the risk of pain or danger. This liturgical season invites us to practice consenting to God in heart and mind, to become a bearer of Christ like Mary.

Empowering Youth in Rural Peru

The cognitive, emotional and practical skills taught are helping students to come up with creative solutions for community-based problems, as well as providing them with alternative ways to improve their living conditions through entrepreneurship.

Liturgy of the Word

First reading: Book of Samuel

Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go and do all that is in your mind, for the Lord is with you.' But that very night the word of the Lord came to Nathan: 'Go and tell my servant David, "Thus the Lord speaks: Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, to be leader of my people Israel; I have been with you on all your expeditions; I have cut off all your enemies before you. I will give you fame as great as the fame of the greatest on earth. I will provide a place for my people Israel; I will plant them there and they shall dwell in that place and never be disturbed again; nor shall the wicked continue to oppress them as they did, in the days when I appointed judges over my people Israel; I will give them rest from all their enemies. The Lord will make you great; the Lord will make you a House. And when your days are ended and your are laid to rest with your ancestors, I will preserve the offspring of your body after you and make his sovereignty secure. I will be a father to him and he a son to me. Your House and your sovereignty will always stand secure before me and your throne be established for ever." The word of the Lord

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 1: 26-38

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour. Listen! You are to conceive and bear a son and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the House of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.' Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about since I am a virgin?' 'The Holy Spirit will come upon you and the power of the Most High will cover you with its shadow. And so the child will be holy and will be called Son of God. Know this too; your kinswomen Elizabeth, herself has conceived a son in her old age.' 'I am the handmaid of the Lord let what you have said be done to me.' said Mary. And the angel left her. The Gospel of the Lord.
