Project Compassion Story—Fourth Sunday of Lent

Memory's Story—Malawi

Growing up in the Mwanza district in southern Malawi, 26-year-old Memory was born to a lowincome family who relies on subsistence farming for survival.



Memory's parents struggled to pay for her school fees and supplies, and she often had to walk to school barefoot. As the eldest of five children, Memory also faced the challenge of balancing her education with domestic chores, such as farming, cooking, cleaning, and carrying water.

Despite the challenges she faced, Memory understood that education was her best chance of breaking the cycle of poverty, I told myself I can't stop going to school because this is the only way I can get a better life.

With the support of Caritas Australia and the Catholic Development Commission in Malawi (CADECOM) – Caritas Australia's local partner in Malawi – Memory enrolled in a technical college where she undertook a three-year carpentry course. Her tuition and boarding fees were partially funded by CADECOM through funds provided by Caritas Australia.

Memory now stands proudly as the first female carpenter from her village, working at one of Malawi's largest hydroelectric power stations. With the income from her job, she can now support her family while inspiring other young women in her community to finish their education and seize opportunities within male dominated industries. industries.

"Being a female carpenter sets an example to others in my community," she said. "They see a woman can do what a man can do."

I would like to take this opportunity to extend my thanks and appreciation to Bede on his leadership of St Anne's Primary School over the past 15 years as Principal. During this time Bede has ensured the development of outstanding facilities and resources for the students of St Anne's, the continued strong enrolment growth of the school, the provision of an educational program that has ensured every child is able to achieve their very best and a wonderful reputation for St Anne's School across the Albury region.

Bede commenced his teaching career at St Michael's Primary School, Deniliquin and moved to Catholic Education Diocese of Wagga Wagga in 1980 as Principal of St Thomas Aquinas Primary School, Tarcutta. He was then appointed as Assistant Principal and then Principal of St Patrick's Primary School, Albury. After three years as Principal of St Peter's Primary School in Port Macquarie he returned to Albury as Principal of St Anne's Primary School in 2009. Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: Second Book of Chronicles

All the heads of the priesthood and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfil the word of th Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed throughout his kingdom: : Thus speaks Cyrus king of Persia, "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of th earth; he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people may his God be with him! Let him go up." The word of the Lord.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 3: 14-21
