Our parish bible study group continues every second and fourth Wednesday of the month at 7.30pm in the parish hall.


Reflection - Fourth Sunday of Easter.

We continue our journey through Eastertide, experiencing the joy of the Risen Lord. This fourth Sunday of Easter traditionally features Jesus as the Good Shepherd, and is also kept annually as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations.

In the First Reading, Peter explains that the miracle he has been able to perform came not from him, but from the name of Jesus Christ, the keystone rejected by the builders. The Psalm, normally sung by pilgrims on their way to Jerusalem, is a thanksgiving prayer from someone who has been rescued from an ordeal. It uses the same cornerstone image as the First Reading. Like Peter, the psalmist acknowledges the Lord as his Saviour.

The writer of the Second Reading stresses that we are God's children. Although we might find the path difficult, and feel unsure of what the future holds, we will be transformed into God's likeness when we meet him. In the Gospel, Jesus describes himself as the Good Shepherd, who is prepared to lay down his life for us; he knows us intimately and wants to bring everyone into his fold.

On this Day of Prayer for Vocations, we might pray that everyone should be willing and able to fulfil their own vocation. We continue to pray for war-torn countries, that they will find a Good Shepherd to guide them out of conflict.



TO PONDER:

The scene of healing in Acts witnesses to the resurrection Christ's great act of love that heals or redeems us all. Like the early disciples, we are also called to participate in this vision of redemptive love. To do so is to know God and be "children of God," as 1 John states. The Gospel further describes what it means to act according to Jesus's example of the good shepherd. To pray and act as the good shepherd brings us to a greater level of compassion and generosity toward all people, particularly the "lost sheep" whom nobody loves. During this season of resurrection, may we continue to pray for the grace to follow Christ's example of redemptive love, and to see that love flowing through those around us.

According to Acts, Jesus was rejected yet became the "cornerstone" or foundation of our faith. To follow Christ's example is hard work. It means being similarly misunderstood or rejected. It involves a radical reorientation away from a concern to fit in, to be part of the mainstream. It involves loving others in a way that might seem illogical, irrational, or beyond the call of duty. It necessitates prayer and grace. Yet 1 John gives us the ultimate reward: one day, these actions will lead us to "see God" face-to-face, to become like God in one continual act of overflowing love.

In what ways have you embraced the radical example of Christ? How are you being called even more deeply into this radical way of love of Jesus the Good Shepherd?



A reading from the first letter of St John

Think of the love that the Father has lavished on us, by letting us be called God's children; and that is what we are. Because the world refused to acknowledge him, therefore it does not acknowledge us. My dear people, we are already the children of God but what we are to be in the future has not yet been revealed; all we know is, that when it is revealed we shall be like him because we shall see him as he really is. The word of the Lord.

> Alleluia, alleluia! I am the good shepherd, says the Lord: I know my sheep and mine know me. Alleluia!



A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 10: 11-18

Jesus said: 'I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd is one who lays down his life for his sheep. The hired man, since he is not the shepherd and the sheep do not belong to him, abandons the sheep and runs away as soon as he sees a wolf coming, and then the wolf attacks and scatters the sheep; this is because he is only a hired man and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for my sheep. And there are other sheep I have that are not of this fold, and these I have to lead as well. They too will listen to my voice, and there will be only one flock, and one shepherd. The Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me; I lay it down of my own free will, and as it is in my power to lay it down, so it is in my power to take it up again; and this is the command I have been given by my Father.'
