
Children's liturgy is offered in Sacred Heart parish community each second and fourth Sunday at 9.30am mass during school terms.

Reflection Second Sunday of Easter

On this Second Sunday of Easter, the readings invite us to believe and trust God's mercy. According to the ways of the world, mercy does not really make sense, but this is the very faith Paul speaks of as that which 'conquers the world': forgiveness begets forgiveness, mercy begets mercy, love begets love (Second Reading). Our need for, and joy in, such graces is echoed in the Psalm, where we can join with the psalmist in saying: 'Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; for his mercy endures forever!'

The Acts of the Apostles (First Reading) shows that the mercy of the risen Lord continues to be poured out through the ministry of his apostles, while in the Gospel we see Jesus himself being the model for mercy for his fearful and doubtful friends.

This coming week, let's pray that, though completely underserving of such a gift of grace, God's divine mercy will have its effect in us, freeing and opening us to love ever more deeply.

TO PONDER:

Easter draws us into different resurrection accounts that reveal how resurrection brings transformation. In John's account, Thomas is the icon of transformation, shifting rapidly from a stance of doubt to one of total abandonment to Jesus as the God of Israel. We too are the disciples. We too are Thomas. We may also live behind "locked doors" such as fears, doubts, and preoccupations. Yet the promise is that Christ comes to us, despite our weaknesses and limitations, to breathe on us and open us to the reality of resurrection. What does the tangible, transformative power of resurrection look like today, in our lives and in our own communities?

The reading from Acts describes the early Christian community as united in a generous spirit and "of one heart and mind." We know the challenges of community life, from small communities (like our families) to large (such as our church and nation). How might this generosity of the early Christians—who "had everything in common" and provided for the need of each person (a generosity grounded in the total self-giving of Christ) - serve as a model for our communities, small and large?

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 20: 19-31 (Abbreviated)

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood amongst them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father send me, so I am sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord,' he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands, and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe.' Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you,' he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand; put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him: 'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.'
