Reflection—Twentieth Sunday of the Year
The readings for this Sunday tell us of the
nourishment that comes from heaven and of our
need to draw everlasting life from our relationship
with Jesus – as well as pursuing wise and Spirit-filled
paths in life. The First Reading makes explicit the
value of Wisdom, depicted as a woman seeking and
inviting everyone to come and be nourished at her
table of learning.

The **Psalm** is a continuation of last week's psalm of thanksgiving. The psalmist tells us that those who seek the Lord lack no blessing. St Paul (**Second Reading**) encourages the early Christians to live with awareness and intelligence, and not to be thoughtless. He advises them to discern and recognise the will of the Lord in their own times, and to live lives filled with the Holy Spirit. This message continues to be relevant to us in the present. In the **Gospel**, Jesus invites those around him to believe in him; to be in communion with him; to live in him and draw life from him, just as he himself draws life from the living Father.

Let us pray for each other throughout this week, that we may seek the nourishment of a life-giving relationship with God, with one another, and with the planet we share.

First Holy Communion

First Holy Communion will be celebrated in the parish of Sacred Heart North Albury over the weekend of Saturday 7 September at 6.00pm & Sunday 8 September at 9.30am. Our commitment masses will be held over the weekend of Saturday 10 August at 6.00pm & Sunday 11 August at 9.30am.

The Eucharist is essential for us: it is Christ who wishes to enter our lives and fill us with his grace. (Pope Francis) The word Eucharist means thanksgiving. Make a list of all the things you give thanks for in your life, the life of your family, the life of our parish community. Is the Eucharist significant in my life? How do I show this? When am I Eucharist for others?

TO PONDER:

Our readings could make us think that we are here to consume. Yet we consume to become what we eat: the Body and Blood of Christ. In John 6, the crowds ask, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" This ancient question is also a contemporary one: What is this great Mystery that makes possible the transformation of bread and wine into Christ's body and blood? But the real question is how we become present to the Mystery, how we allow ourselves to become the flesh that is given for the life of the world. This is not a pie-in-the-sky idea; this Mystery at the heart of our faith is enfleshed in our daily actions, in our care for others.

At this stage we are seeking to attain expressions of interest so that the viability of holding such a function can be determined.



A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians 5:15-20

Gospel Acclamation:

All who eat my flesh and drink my blood live in me and I in them, says the Lord.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 6:51—58

Jesus said to the crowd: 'I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: 'How can this man give us his flesh to eat?' they said.

Jesus replied: 'I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven: not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.' The Gospel of the Lord.
