Congratulations and Blessings First Holy Communicants

This weekend many of our children will receive the gift of the Eucharist for the first time.

Let us reflect on the words of Pope Francis 'The Eucharist is essential for us: it is Christ who wishes to enter our lives and fill us with his grace.' (Pope Francis)

Just as the bread and wine are turned into the real body and blood of Christ, so too are those who receive the gifts, transformed into a living Eucharist, becoming the Body of Christ for others.' (Pope Francis)

On 6 August 2023 Pope Francis reflecting on who is welcome in the church reasserted 'The Lord is clear—the sick the elderly, the young, old, ugly, beautiful, good and bad. Everyone is welcome.'

The rite of baptism acknowledges the role of parents as the first teachers of their children in the way of faith. The final blessing concludes 'May you be the best of teachers bearing witness to the faith by what you say and what you do." Pope Francis reminds us that faith is not a thing of the past, like an artefact in a museum. Rather faith is a born and reborn from a life giving encounter with Jesus from experiencing how his mercy illumines every situation in our lives. May your own faith be nurtured and nourished inspired and enlightened so that your children will more closely follow the call of Jesus in their lives.

He has also promised them a share in his kingdom that he will give to everyone who loves him.



A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 7:31-37

Returning from the district of Tyre, Jesus went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, right through the Decapolis region. And they brought him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they asked him to lay his hand on him. He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. 'He has done all things well,' they said 'he makes the deaf hear and the dumb speak.'
