Priest: The second candle on the Advent wreath represents Peace. Often called the Bethlehem Candle, this candle reminds us of Mary and Joseph's journey from Nazareth to Bethlehem before Mary gave birth to Jesus. Building on the meaning of the Candle of Hope, this second candle recalls that after all the division, destruction and dispersion of the Kingdom in the Old Testament, there might be peace on earth—Jesus is coming and so is his Kingdom of Peace.

As we light the second candle of Advent we pray for peace in our world, in our hearts and in our lives.

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: From the prophet Jeremiah 33:14-16

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress, put on the beauty of the glory of God for ever, wrap the cloak of the integrity of God around you, put the diadem of the glory of the Eternal on your head: since God means to show your splendour to every nation under heaven, since the name God gives you for ever will be, 'Peace through integrity, and honour through devotedness.' A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 3:1-6

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah: 'A voice cries in the wilderness: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.
