Speaking to thousands of visitors and pilgrims in the Vatican audience hall on Thursday 12 December Pope Francis declared, 'The most beautiful gift the Catholic Church and its members can give the world is a reason to live with hope. The Christian cannot be satisfied with having hope; he or she must also radiate hope, be a sower of hope. Hope is not an empty word or a vague desire of ours that things may turn out for the best; it is a certainty because it is founded on God's fidelity to his prom-At a pivotal moment in the film 'Shawshank Redemption', Andy says 'Remember hope is a good thing, maybe the best of things and no good thing ever dies.' ## A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians 4:4-7

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 3:10-18

When all the people asked John, 'What must we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two tunics he must share with the man who has none, and the one with something to eat must do the same'. There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them, 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your pay!'

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in the fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.
