Maintenance Update

Thanks is extended to Les & Judy Murray for coming out of retirement to refresh the line-marking in the car park area. A new floor in the reading room has been constructed to replace the old one which had disintegrated due to dry rot and the broken wooden poles renewed in the parking bay area. Total cost \$4,776.14.

Our most recent water rates bill amounted to \$2,684.74. We received parishioner donations of \$600 to help offset this expenditure.

Thank you for continuing to support our parish community liturgically, pastorally and financially. If you are not already contributing to our second collection through envelopes, tap n go, or direct debit, you are encouraged to do so, as this is the only means we have of servicing our financial commitments.

TO PONDER: The anonymity of Isaiah's servant gives him a universal application and allows each of us to name the servant from our own experiences. It also prompts us to see aspects of ourselves reflected in each character: we are the suffering and the weary, we are the persecutors, and we are the servant standing up for the least among us. The long account of Christ's passion similarly invites us to see ourselves mirrored in the cast of characters. As you meditate with these texts, with whom do you identify today?

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: From the prophet Isaiah 50:4-7

The Lord has given me a disciple's tongue. So that I may know how to reply to the wearied he provides me with speech. Each morning he wakes me to hear, to listen like a disciple. The Lord has opened my ear. For my part, I made no resistance, nether did I turn away. I offered my back to those who struck me, my cheeks to those who tore at my beard; I did not cover my face against insult and spittle. The Lord comes to my help, so that I am untouched by the insults. So, too, I set my face like flint; I know I shall not be shamed. The word of the Lord.

(When the Psalm is sung, the words will vary slightly but the meaning remains the same.)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians

His state was divine; yet Christ Jesus did not cling to his equality with God, but emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave, and became as we are; and being as all people are, he was humbler yet even to accepting death, death on a cross. But God raised him high and gave him the name which is above all other names so that all beings in the heavens, on earth and in the underworld, should bend the knee at the name of Jesus and that every tongue should acclaim Jesus Christ as Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 19:28-40

Jesus went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. Now when he was near Bethphage and Bethany, close by the Mount of Olives as it is called, he sent two of the disciples, telling them, 'Go off to the village opposite and as you enter it you will find a tethered colt that no one has yet ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, "Why are you untying it?" you are to say this, "The Master needs it." The messengers went off and found everything just as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owner said, 'Why are you untying that colt?' and they answered, 'The Master needs it.'

So they took the colt to Jesus and throwing their garments over its back they helped Jesus on to it. As he moved off, people spread their cloaks in the road, and now, as he was approaching the downward slope of the Mount of Olives, the whole group of disciples joyfully began to praise God at the top of their voices for the miracles they had seen. They cried out: 'Blessings on the King who comes, in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest heavens!'

Some Pharisees in the crowd said to him, 'Master, check your disciples,' but he answered, 'I tell you, if these keep silence the stones will cry out.'
