

Returned home to the Father—Jorge Mario Bergoglio (Pope Francis)

Pope Francis, born Jorge Mario Bergoglio, passed away on April 21, 2025—Easter Monday—at 88 from a cerebral stroke. The Vatican confirmed his death which followed recent hospitalization due to a respiratory infection. As the first Latin American pope and a powerful voice for compassion, inclusion and reform, Pope Francis leaves a legacy of hope and transformation. Some Pope Francis quotes for your prayerful reflection.

- "I believe in God, not in a Catholic God; there is no Catholic God. There is God, and I believe in Jesus Christ, his incarnation. Jesus is my teacher and my pastor, but God, the Father, Abba, is the light and the Creator. This is my Being."
- "I prefer a church which is bruised, hurting and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a church which is unhealthy from being confined and from clinging to its own security."
- "The Church must be a place of mercy freely given, where everyone can feel welcomed, loved, forgiven, and encouraged to live the good life of the Gospel."
- "Whenever we encounter another person in love, we learn something new about God."
- "The Lord never tires of forgiving. It is we who tire of asking for forgiveness."

Eternal rest give to Francis, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May he rest in peace and rise in glory. Copies of a reflection 'Remembering Pope Francis' written by Mark Coleridge, Archbishop of Brisbane are available for collection at the Swan Street entrance.

First Reading: A reading from the Acts of the Apostles 5:12-16

The faithful all used to meet by common consent in the Portico of Solomon. A reading from the book of the Apocalypse 1:9-13,17-19

My name is John and through our union in Jesus I am your brother and share your sufferings your kingdom and all you endure. I was on the island of Patmos for having preached God's word and witnessed for Jesus; it was the Lord's day and Spirit possessed me, and I heard a voice behind me, shouting like a trumpet, 'Write down all that you see in a book.' I turned round to see who had spoken to me, and when I turned I saw seven golden lamp-stands and surrounded by the a figure like a Son of Man, dressed in a long robe tied at the waist with a golden girdle. When I saw, I fell in a dead faint at his feet, but he touched me with his right hand and said. 'Do not be afraid it is I, the First and the Last; I am the Living One. I was dead and now I am to live for ever and ever and I hold the keys of death and of the underworld. Now write down all that you see of present happenings and things that are still to come.' The word of the Lord.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia!

You believe in me, Thomas because you have seen me; happy those who have not seen me, but still believe.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 20:19-31

In the evening of that same day, the first day of the week, the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, 'Peace be with you,' and showed them his hands and his side. The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord, and he said to them again, 'Peace be with you. As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.' After saying this he breathed on them and said: 'Receive the Holy Spirit. For those whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; for those whose sins you retain, they are retained.'

Thomas, called the Twin, who was one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. When the disciples said, 'We have seen the Lord', he answered, 'Unless I see the holes that the nails made in his hands and unless I can put my hand into his side, I refuse to believe'.

Eight days later the disciples were in the house again and Thomas was with them. The doors were closed, but Jesus came in and stood among them. 'Peace be with you', he said. Then he spoke to Thomas, 'Put your finger here; look, here are my hands. Give me your hand: put it into my side. Doubt no longer but believe.' Thomas replied, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him: 'You believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' These things are recorded so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing this you may have life through his name. The Gospel of the Lord.
