Conclave Election of Pope Leo XIV

Around 1.4 billion Catholics around the globe now look to a new spiritual leader. The election of Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost as the 267th Pope marks two historic milestones. He is the first Pope born in the United States and the first to come from the Augustinian order.

Pope Leo XIV steps into the role at a pivotal moment for the church, carrying forward a legacy of reform and compassion. For many years he worked as a missionary in Peru and served two terms as Prior General of the Augustinian Order. He was appointed Bishop of Chiclayo on September 26, 2015. On January 30, 2023, the Pope called him to Rome as Prefect of the Dicastery for Bishops and President of the Pontifical Commission for Latin America, promoting him to the rank of Archbishop. He was created a cardinal on September 30, 2023.

Pope Leo's first words to the assembled crowd in St Peters Square were the words of the risen Jesus spoken to the disciples gathered in the locked room. "Peace be with you" Signalling strong continuity with the papacy of Pope Francis, Pope Leo told the crowd that God "loves all of us unconditionally" and that the Church must be open to everyone.

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading: From Acts the Acts of the Apostles 14:21-27

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships,' they said, 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe. They passed through Pisidia and reach Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed. On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

Alleluia, alleluia!


I give you a new commandment: love one another as I have loved you. Alleluia!
