First Reading: From the book of Proverbs 8:22-31

The Wisdom of God cries aloud: The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water. Before the mountains were settled before the hills, I came to birth; before he made the earth, the countryside, or the first grains of the world's dust. Gospel Acclamation:


Alleluia, alleluia!
