TO PONDER:

In 2 Timothy, persistence is about proclaiming the truth of Christ even in an environment of corruption and "counterfeit faith". The Gospel then describes persistence in prayer in a way that may contradict our experiences: in real life, persistent prayer does not guarantee that we receive what we (think we) need or want. Yet persistence can bring other, unimagined graces that may surpass our expectations.

As you pray with these readings, consider your own prayer life and what these graces have been. Some may be obvious, while others may be more subtle or even unrecognized before today.

Live Streaming



Liturgy of the Word

First Reading from the book of Exodus 17:8—13

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses's arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm until sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to Timothy

All scripture is inspired by God and can profitably be used for teaching, for refuting error, for guiding people's lives and teaching them to be holy. This is how the man who is dedicated to God becomes fully equipped and ready for any good work.

Before God and before Christ Jesus who s to be judge of the living and the dead, I put this duty to you, in the name of his Appearing and of his kingdom; proclaim the message and welcome or unwelcome, insist on it. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 18:1—8

In the same town there was a widow who kept on coming to him and saying, 'I want justice from you against my enemy!' For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, 'Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death.'
