FEAST OF ALL SOULS

PENITENTIAL RITE

FR BERNIE: Christ, you are the light and our hope. Through your resurrection you shattered the bonds of death and offered new life to all who believe in you. Amid the pain of loss and grief, show us the way to discover the warmth and power of your love.

FR BERNIE: This first candle we light to remember those whom we have loved and who have died. We pause to remember their names, their faces, their voices, their memory that binds them to us in this season.

(Pause while first candle is lit.)

ALL: May God's eternal love surround them.

FR BERNIE: This second candle we light to redeem the pain of loss—the loss of relationships, the loss of jobs, the loss of health. (Pause while the second candle is lit.) We pause to gather up the pain of the past and offer it to God asking that from God's hands we receive the gift of peace.

ALL: Redeem, renew, restore, us O God and lead us into your future.

FR BERNIE: This third candle we light for ourselves. We pause to remember these past weeks, months and years; the disbelief, the anger, the down times, the hugs and handshakes of family and friends, all who stood with us. (Pause while third candle is lit.)

ALL: Let us remember that dawn defeats darkness.

FR BERNIE: This fourth candle we light to remember our faith and the gift of hope, which the resurrection of Jesus offers us. (Pause while fourth candle is lit.) We remember that God chose to share our life and to be 'Emmanuel' God with us.

ALL: Let us remember the one who shows the way, who brings the truth and who bears the light.

FR BERNIE: May Almighty God have mercy on us forgive us our sins and bring us to the gift of eternal life.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans 5:5-11

Hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us. We were still helpless when at his appointed moment Christ died for sinful men. It is not easy to die even for a good man—though of course for someone really worthy, a man might be prepared to die—but what proves that God loves us is that Christ died for us while we were still sinners. Having died to make us righteous, is it likely that he would now fail to save us from God's anger? When we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, we were still enemies; now that we have been reconciled, surely we may count on being saved by the life of his Son? Not merely because we have been reconciled but because we are filled with joyful trust in God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we already gained our reconciliation. The Word of the Lord.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 7:11-17

Jesus went to a town called Nain, accompanied by his disciples and a great number of people. When he was near the gate of the town it happened that a dead man was being carried out for burial, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow. And a considerable number of the townspeople were with her. When the Lord saw her he felt sorry for her. 'Do not cry,' he said.
