

With today's Gospel from St John, Christmastide flows almost seamlessly into Ordinary Time. Christmas ends with the 'revelation' of the Son of God, and Ordinary Time begins with the Baptist recognising Jesus as the Lamb of God. If we, also, recognise Jesus as the Chosen One of God, what does that mean? What does it ask of us?

A way forward can be readily found in the three other texts of today's liturgy: doing God's will and delighting in God's law in the depth of our heart (Psalm); taking our place among all the saints, the holy people of Jesus Christ (Second Reading); and being a light for the nations so that God's salvation may reach all people (First Reading).

Let us pray, this week, that by 'seeing' God, both at work in the world and present to us in our lives, we might bear witness to the Chosen One by the daily choices we make.

Parish News

To Ponder

As we transition from Christmas to Ordinary Time, the call to discipleship is strong and urgent. Our readings bridge the two seasons by remaining with the Suffering Servant poems in Isaiah and with John the Baptist at the beginning of Jesus's ministry. The servant and John have a deep connection with God, as does Paul. God formed each of these figures to be unique prophetic witnesses and lights to the world. God has also formed each of us as unique witnesses. Now that we have celebrated Jesus's birth, Ordinary Time invites us to meditate upon this great gift and ponder our response. What does it mean to be called forth by God as a witness? Are we open to hearing the call, and are we ready to respond with the power of the psalmist: "Here am I, Lord: I come to do your will"?

To Ponder

Witness begins with recognition. In the Gospel, John the Baptist is waiting on Jesus and is receptive to God's revelation. Twice he states that he "did not know" Jesus. Yet he still recognises Jesus instantly, stating, "He is the one." He calls his audience to stop and behold the son of God, who will heal the collective brokenness of the world and bridge us back to a relationship with God. John recognises that Jesus is the one he has been waiting and longing for, the one who will not disappoint. As you pray with the Gospel, imagine yourself in John's shoes saying the same words about Jesus: "He is the one." What is this experience like? Today, in the context of your own life, can you describe what (or whom) you are waiting and longing for most?

Media Release 15 January 2026 from the National Catholic Education Commission on School Fees

The National Catholic Education Commission has released a statement challenging the recent Cost of Education report issued by Futurity Investment. The report paints a misleading picture of the nature of fees in Catholic schools across the country, causing unnecessary alarm for parents who make the choice of education that best suits the needs of their children – whether that is a government, Catholic or independent school.

Year after year parents continue to choose a Catholic education because it is the best fit for their child and family. Parents should keep in mind that additional costs beyond tuition can vary greatly, and not every family experiences all the ancillary expenses mentioned in the report.

Catholic Education is committed to accessible education and works with its families to ensure that an inability to pay does not deny a family access to a Catholic education.

Our schools have long been a mechanism to support the most disadvantaged and provide for the common good. Any family who needs assistance is encouraged to speak to their school principal about options for support.
